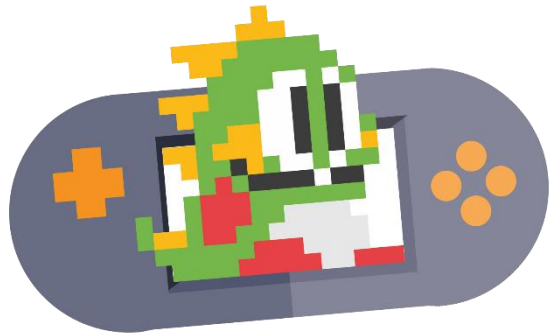
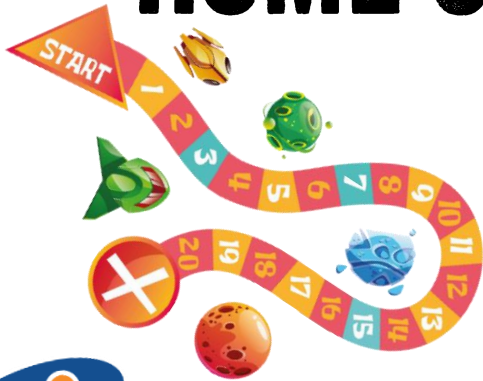

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HOW TO CREATE YOUR OWN GAME...

TO START ASK YOURSELF:

- **What types of games do you play?**
Sample answers: video games, board games, cards games
- **What are the components of the games you play?**
Sample answers: dice, tokens, cards, mouse, controller, board, timer, pen
- **What are the names of the games you play?**
Sample answers: Snap, Snakes & Ladders, Chess, Video games, etc.
- **What are the themes of the games you play?**

Sample answers: war, money, history, sports



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THINGS TO THINK ABOUT WHEN CREATING YOUR OWN GAME....

- Which Sustainable Development Goal(s) does your game explore? (see slide 3)
- What do the players learn from playing the game?
- How do you play the game?
- What are the rules?
- How do you win?
- What are the components of the game? (e.g. cards, dice, counters, pens, board etc.)
- What materials are you using to create your game? (e.g. recyclable materials: cereal boxes, cardboard, envelopes, bottle caps, etc.)
- What does the game look like? (design, colour, images, text, etc.)



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How are the games submitted?

1. Games must be created at home.
2. Board Games & Card Games can be created using a variety of materials (e.g. recyclable materials: cereal boxes, envelopes, bottle caps etc... be creative with what you can find at home).
3. You can enter the competition as an individual or as a team (e.g. parents/guardians, brothers, sisters or others in your household)
4. Play test the game with others.
5. Fill out the Entry Form (see next slide).

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LEARNING THROUGH GAMES....

Game-based learning is an excellent way for young people to engage in global justice issues in a fun and innovative way. Games have the potential to provide young people with a range of skills, such as creativity and imagination, critical thinking and problem-solving, team-working and collaboration, and skills related to their life long learning.

PRIMARY: Potential ROI & NI links into Maths, English, Art, SPHE/PD&MU and SESE (Geography, History, Science)/WAU.

POST PRIMARY: Potential ROI & NI links into CSPE/LLW, Geography, Art, Science, English, Politics & Society and Global Citizenship.

YOUTH: Games also have the potential to provide young people with a range of skills related to youth work outcomes, such as engagement, being civically engaged, socially and environmentally conscious

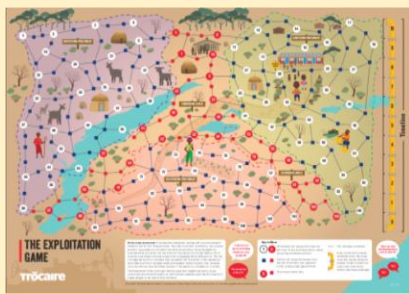
HUMAN RIGHTS DEFENDERS
